### **Covid19 Secure Information for Services at St John's**

We are very excited about meeting together in church; it is different, but there is something really significant about being the people of God gathered for worship.

We hope this will help to encourage and guide you.

- Please arrive slightly earlier as everyone will need to wash or sanitize their hands as they arrive, which may take a little time.
- Please enter through the main Foyer doors. You may exit through the Atrium door if your car is parked in the playground.
- We may need to queue outside briefly, practicing social distance as we do so.
- A Welcome Team will be in place to help direct you when you arrive.
- Face coverings for all attending are mandatory. (The face coverings are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from Coronavirus and they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing.)
- Please bring your name and contact details on a slip of paper or sign in on the sheet provided. This is so we know who was present if the need should arise for a Test and Trace for Covid19. Details will only be kept for 21 days.
- Using your phone - please scan the Test and Trace QR Code if you wish.
- There is a one-way system around the building to help to minimise contact.
- Seats have been moved to maintain social distancing.
- Congregational singing is not permitted.
- Kid's and Youth groups will be running at the 10.30am or 11am services, please contact Kev Metcalfe or Chris Adams for more information about how they will be organised.
- Tea/coffee after the services will not be provided.
- Toilets are available. Please use the sanitizer in the Atrium beforehand and clean the surfaces afterwards, as requested in the cubicle.
- You are welcome to stay and chat after the services, but please wait until you are outside the building and continue to maintain social distancing. Please keep the exit doors clear for those coming out. Current Government guidelines mean that groups of more than 6 should not meet socially. Please be mindful of this when you leave the building to ensure we keep to the guidelines.
  
- **It is essential that you do not attend church if you, or any members of your household, have symptoms of Coronavirus (i.e. a new continuous cough, temperature, loss or change to your normal sense of taste or smell) – you should self-isolate at home with the other members of your household, following the government advice.**
